When you completed your Ordeal, you became a full member of the Order of the Arrow. You could attend all meetings and do everything (except attend Brotherhood/ Vigil ceremonies, etc.). In short, you were "entitled to all rights and

privileges of membership in the Order of the Arrow" (OA Handbook). So, if Ordeal members are full members, is there nothing special about Brotherhood except getting two bars on your sash? Actually, Brotherhood is an important part of your induction into the OA. That's right, induction. The Induction Sequence starts with your election and ends when you seal your membership in the Brotherhood Ceremony. The Brotherhood experience is carefully structured to bring you to a new level of understanding

about your Ordeal, the OA, and yourself. It's truly an amazing experience! OK, so how do you convert to Brotherhood? It's not hard! As for getting more troops involved, we are already making good progress. The local Mormon

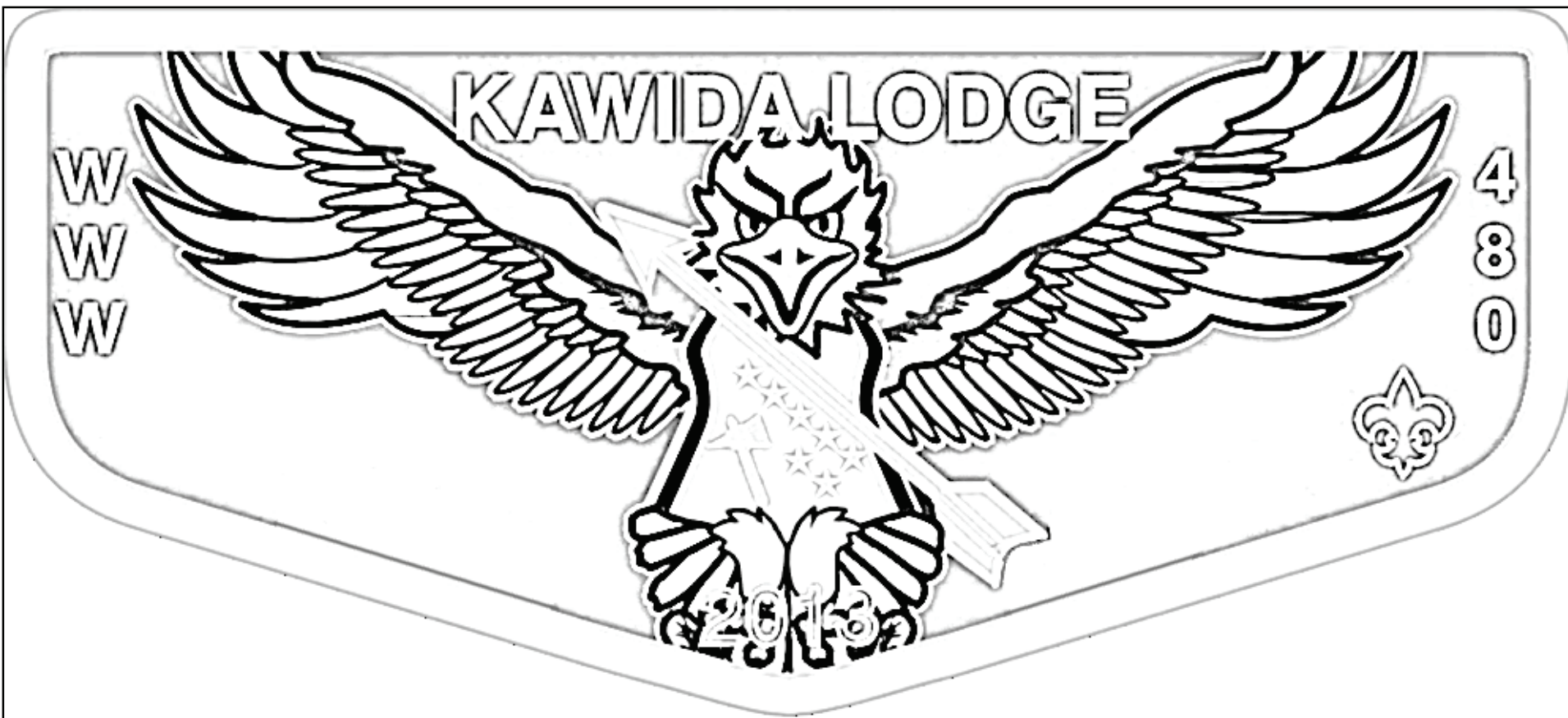
