Conclave

This year, conclave is being held at Camp Kia Kima in Arkansas on April 15th – 17th. The hosting council's camp is undergoing renovation, so the conclave is being hosted out of the section boundary. Because of the distance of the event, Kawida Lodge will be renting several 15 seat vans in order to get there. The event charge from the section is \$51. In order to pay for the vans, our lodge will be charging an additional \$50. If you Register before 3/1/16 you may get a \$6 dollar discount. A few lodge members have expressed interest in running for section positions. We look forward to supporting them in their endeavors.

NEXT, A New Century

NEXT is an event that will be held at Indiana University this summer. The event will consist of a National COC, and specialized training for future leaders in the OA. By request of the National OA committee, the Lodge Chief and Lodge Adviser should hold spots on this contingent. Lodge Chief Aaron Reynolds put together a committee of LEC members to select members of the lodge to go. The contingent to NEXT will consist of 5 total spots (two adults and three youth).

Prism


